Something to Pray About



Then he said, "I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob." At this, Moses hid his face, because he was afraid to look at God.

—Exodus 3:6 NKJV



We need Patriarchs. Now, I am not advocating a return to a fully patriarchal society. Still, what is going on in our world today brings to my mind that old adage, "Don't throw the baby out with the bath water."



According to God's Word and the history of the Israelites, and throughout thousands of years of various cultures, the man has been the leader or authority figure of the family. Like all positions of authority or power, that privilege and honor has often been abused and taken to the extreme. I don't think God ever envisioned a dictatorship in the family. Through the Apostle Paul, we have

been assured that in Christ there is neither male nor female (see Galations 3:28), and the husband is to love the wife as Christ loved the Church (see Ephesians 5:25). When there are two authority figures – husband and wife – there has to be a way to settle an impasse or disagreement; thus, God set up the man as the ultimate leader. Maybe that statement makes you angry or uncomfortable. What it should do is make a woman realize how important her choice of a husband and father for her children is. And it ought to make a man see how important and necessary his role in the family is.

Christ is the head of the Church. He is also the ultimate head of the family. The husband is under the authority of Christ and the husband is ultimately responsible for the spiritual and physical and emotional well-being of his wife and children. He will be held accountable—more accountable than his wife.

Did you know that psychologists and sociologists are now referring to adolescence as the time between 11 and 30 years of age? It used to be considered as being between 11 and 18 years of age. Our boys are growing up physically, but they are not becoming men. They are not taking on adult responsibilities and behaviors. These "men" are more interested in acquiring the latest electronic gadget or game or what their favorite sports team or figure is doing than they are about their career, marrying and raising a family, or what is happening politically in their community or nation, or attending and supporting their church with their time and money (if they even bother to go to church).

Our society needs men who are willing and able to be responsible men; and we also need them to become patriarchs. A good patriarch is a man who has taken on the responsibility of raising, supporting, and leading a family, and has also contributed to the betterment of his community and its welfare in some way. He is a steady, strong, centering influence for the whole family and even the community he lives and works in. A Christian patriarch's stand

Gerald called the meeting to order at 4:30 p.m. He read from the "love chapter" in 1 Corinthians. Ricky Baker said the opening prayer.

Minutes of previous meeting stand as written.

Financial Report: Jo Nell reported that the defibrillator was taken out of the office budget. David suggested that we check with our insurance carrier and see if having it will lead to a decrease in our insurance payments.

Our income is still running a little under the budget, though we seem to have caught up in the first week in March.

Eric mentioned that he will be getting with the PPRC and Finance Committee and work up a capital campaign to see if we can get the building paid off before we have to renew the loan in 2016.

Jo Nell said that we are not making any money on our cd. She suggested that we take \$25,000 of that and put it on the principle of the building loan. Jeanette Teague made a motion that we put \$30,000 on the principle. Warren seconded. General discussion was held. Warren did give us a warning about the possibility of roof work and septic/water problems at the parsonage, so we do need some cash available. The motion carried. The remainder of the cd will be marked as savings, and put into the church checking account.

Jo Nell informed us that if we hire someone for special work that we will need a W-9 form filled out on them.

OLD BUSINESS

Jimmy let us know that we can set up a database with cell phone numbers, and we can send out text messages or emails to those members who have a phone and/or e-mail. Then we would need to designate people to contact those people who do not have cell phones or email. Jimmy and Cindy will work on a database for this and get it set-up.

CPR classes will be set up in the near future. David Crouse will take care of that.

Eric has decided against going to the continuing education event he mentioned at the last meeting.

Anthony said that he has taken care of the shirt for the Tractor Power Show. Half a page in the booklet would be \$175. It is \$125 for the quarter page. Bob made a motion that we do a half page. Marsha made a second. There was no further discussion and the motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS

David Crouse brought information from the United Methodist Men that on May 3^{rd} that we will have a housekeeping day, and the men will serve lunch to those who come to work. Time is 8:00-12:00 p.m. This will be heavily promoted to get as many people here to help with the work as possible.

April 13th the men's group will have a chicken and dumpling lunch as a fundraiser for the men's group.

Donations will be accepted.

Gerald mentioned the Layman's Revival and that we still need speakers. Please contact Gerald or Bleaka Hollar if you want to volunteer.

Kim Ellis requested that if someone has any maps of the world or Middle East, she would like to have them for her class, so that she doesn't have to buy them.

Evangelism/Witness/Outreach
Committee is working on reaching out to
the people who are not attending church
on a regular basis (members and nonmembers). Bleaka requested that we
pray for these people and this effort.
They will also work to contact our
visitors and invite them back also. Eric
will get a list to us, so that we can pray
for those who are not coming. Church
council members, we are leaders in the
church and need to step up and help with
this process.

Eric mentioned the combined service on March 30th will be in the sanctuary and be a traditional type service, because much of the praise band will be gone that week. They will do a song or two, though. Bob Sears gave the closing prayer, and the meeting was adjorned.




