### Something to Pray About by Cindy Sears

"When you pray do not use a lot of meaningless words, as the pagans do, who think that their gods will hear them because their prayers are long. Do not be like them. Your Father already knows what you need before you ask him. This then is how you should



need before you ask him. This then is how you should pray: Our Father in heaven, may your holy name be honored..." —Matthew 6:7-9 GNT

The United Methodist Church is facing a potential break-up; the United States is experiencing the worst political partisanship stand-off in decades; our Ebenezer Church is struggling to continue our ministries and pay our bills. It is way past time for regular, persistent, and concentrated prayer.

Jesus told us to ask, seek, and knock. (see Matthew 7:7) It seems that we often leave off the first part of that admonition and attempt to find the answers ourselves, or knock on the wrong doors. The Apostle Paul tells us to "be persistent in prayer, and keep alert as you pray, giving thanks to God." (Colossians 4:2) James, the half-brother of Jesus, is said to have had calloused knees from kneeling so much to pray. How many of us have calloused knees from praying? Or have sore arms and hands from holding our hands together as we pray? Do we set aside any particular time to pray every day? Can we even turn off the TV or the radio, etc. long enough to pray?

Physical sickness, emotional sickness, and spiritual sickness are rampant in our society—and in our church. We need to communicate regularly with our God—for solace, encouragement, strength, and peace in these times of stress and disagreement. Also, we should be thanking God regularly and fervently for the current great economy, a strong military to protect us here and abroad, and many wonderful material things we all enjoy every day. Historically, most of us are living better than kings and dictators and the very wealthy used to live only decades ago. When we pause long enough to open our eyes to our blessings, we see how good God truly is. When we pray regularly, we also find it easier to remember WHO is really in charge—GOD; not you, not me, not the government.

I am asking for people who are willing to meet weekly to pray for individuals in our local church, and to pray for the UMC, our country, etc. to contact me and let me know they are interested and will be dedicated to attending a weekly meeting. I am considering a weekday afternoon (after my work hours at the church), and/or a meeting on Sunday afternoon for those who work during the week (or Saturday morning or afternoon if that is better for our members). We will discuss an agenda for the meetings, and limit the time to what is most convenient for the participants at a set-up meeting near the end of February or first of March if I get enough responses. This will be a praying session, not a social gathering. I want people who can be serious about prayer; about lifting our requests up to God, and expectantly waiting for a positive answer. I hope to keep a record of our prayer request (which will be as specific as possible), and the answers that we receive.

David Crouse welcomed the new members and visitors. He then read 1 Corinthians 12:8-27, and a devotional story that went with it. We were reminded that each person has his own gift or talent. Yet, we are one body, so all parts are important. Sonya opened us with prayer.

After the Reading of the minutes from Nov., they were accepted as written.

### Jo Nell Finance Report:

Jo Nell asked for a method of approving the irregular bills that come in. Also, she needs to know which fund the bill needs to come out of.

### **Taught to Be Depressed**


The bottom line: The reason so many young people are depressed, unhappy and angry is the left has told them that God and Judeo-Christian religions are nonsense; their country is largely evil; their past is deplorable; and their future is hopeless.

That seems to be a major reason, if not the reason, for so much unhappiness: not capitalism, not inequality, not patriarchy, sexism, racism, homophobia or xenophobia but rather having no religion, no God, no spouse, no community, no country to believe in and, ultimately, no meaning. That explains much of the unprecedented unhappiness.

And it explains the widespread adoption of that secular substitute for traditional religion: leftism. But unlike Judaism and Christianity, leftism does not bring its adherents happiness.
