Pastor's Corner — Rev. Eric Lane

Once again we come to the beginning of a new calendar year. With the New Year comes the excitement that 2014 will bring with it new beginnings. Wouldn't it be great if every January 1 we could wipe clean the slate of our lives and start completely over again?



Sadly, while we can make New Year resolutions concerning goals that we set for our lives in the coming Year, we really don't get a chance to start fresh and new. However, with Christ we do have an opportunity to start anew. 2 Corinthians 5:17 reads, "So if anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation: everything old has passed away; see everything has become new!"

Sure, accepting Christ as our Lord doesn't make our bills go away, and may not free us from the human struggles that we face in life; but with Christ we are given a new life, one that goes beyond the realm of this world.

Something to Pray About by Cindy Sears

For the word of God is living and powerful, and sharper than any two-edged sword, piercing even to the division of soul and spirit, and of joints and marrow, and is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart.

—Hebrews 4:12 NKJV



Although the Holy Bible remains the best seller of all time, it is probably the least read best seller of all time, too. What keeps people from reading the Bible? Is it busyness, laziness, or fear?

I realize that our world today is full of distractions, which makes it difficult to set aside time for reading anything, let alone the Bible. After all, the Bible is not just one book; it is 66 books in all. It is also very old—and we prefer new things today. So biblical ignorance is rampant in our society; but, sadly, it is also rampant within the Church. Busyness is not a good reason though—not for Christians. We always find time to do what we really want to do. Make the commitment to read and the time will be available.

I have often heard people say that they just don't understand the Bible or that they find it difficult to read. This complaint is a hard sale today. There are at least 50 different translations available in the English language. As of 2012, parts of the Bible have been translated into 2,778 languages. The whole Bible is available in 518 world languages. There is even a Manga version (graphical/picture type) and a version using Cockney rhyming slang. No one has to wade through the old King James Version, which used old English language and grammar. (Actually, we don't even have the original old King James Version or only old English scholars would be able to read it.) Language is fluid, not static; and these translations help keep the Bible readable for every generation. There is a translation out there, especially for English readers, which you can understand. Drop that excuse.



As for the fear, I can understand that one. For as the verse in Hebrews 4:12 tells us, God's Word is "sharper than a two-edged sword." When you read the Bible regularly, you will be changed. This will be a blessing, but, at first, it may feel more like a curse. As with surgery to remove a cancerous tumor, when God removes evil

from us, it can hurt and take time for a full recovery.

Yet, the Bible is a "feast of blessings, promises, hopes, assurances, encouragements, warnings, guidelines—essentially everything we need to navigate this perilous obstacle course we call life." I highly recommend you find a way around your obstacles or objections and read the Word daily. Please accept the challenge from Emily Johnson and read through the Bible in 2014, even if you do not want to officially join the Bible reading group. She can point you to a Bible reading plan that will be more pleasurable than a "read straight through" option.

As you read, do not expect to understand everything you read. God's

Gerald Frye called the meeting to order and opened us with prayer. Reading of the minutes; minutes approved as written.

Financial Report: Eric Lane presented the information for Jo Nell and opened the floor to questions. Eric brought forth a motion to move the Thanksgiving meal funds to the Food Ministry program. Bleaka Hollar second. After general discussion, the motion passed. Eric will also go to the person who wrote the bus fund check and ask if we can move this to the General Fund or somewhere else.

The floor was opened to questions. Concerning the question about the CD; we are waiting until the first of year to decide what to do about that. The Financial report was approved.

OLD BUSINESS: Rocking chair for Nursery is not yet resolved. Concerning the light change over (from florescent to LED) suggestion is to wait until we have to change them. First Aid kit supplies have been bought and will be put in the cabinet. Automated defibrillator costs and training was then discussed. David explained that the \$1800 cost was a package deal with case and other supplies needed. Once we get the item, there will need to be training for people in the church to use the equipment. We have 4 qualified people at this time. David is checking on having someone come to the church and teach a CPR class. We will bring this up again in

January 2014.

NEW BUSINESS: Cindy made a motion to get keys made that people could check out when needing to use the CLC. There was general discussion over this. Bleaka said that she is willing to come and open and lock doors if she knows about the events. It was suggested that we give renters phone numbers to call if they cannot get in the building. Motion was rejected.

Eric brought up that we now have a form for borrowing tables and chairs. People need to go through the Trustees first to borrow them. There was no more new business.

Eric thanked everyone for their participation on the board this past year.

UMW is going to fix breakfast for the Gateway School on Dec. 20th. There was a motion by Bleak Hollar and a second by Judy McCrary that if they need money for the food items, can we take it from the evangelism funds. Motion passed.

David Crouse brought up that the Pairs and Spares class wants to prepare a meal for the school, too, early next year. He will ask the UMM for help also. We will decide on that in January.

Eric finished his thanks and said that he was looking forward to more ministry and missions work in the coming year.

Gerald thanked people for their vote of confidence in him to chair the council in the coming year. God has placed each one of us in positions of responsibility and we need to use our resources for His glory and the work of His Kingdom. Jimmy Stone dismissed us with prayer.

ways and His thoughts are higher than ours (see Isaiah 55:8-11). There are some passages that are obscure even to scholars and theologians. Some passages may leave you scratching your head today, but when you read the same passages again later in life, the Holy Spirit will turn on the light bulb of understanding for you right when you need it. Be willing to listen to what the Word is saying, and do not attempt to add to it or twist it around to suit your own desires. Do not be quick to put your own spin on His Words (see Proverbs 30:5-6). If you get behind in your reading, don't just give up. Play catch-up or just start from the day you ought to be on. Be consistent and committed but not obsessive.

Remember that "All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness..." But don't forget to read the next verse in that passage, which says, "...that the man of God may be complete, thoroughly equipped for every good work," (2 Timothy 3:16-17). God's Word is not meant to just be read; it is meant to be acted upon—to lead to action. Use it to defend yourself in times of temptation, to encourage you in times of affliction, to guide you when making decisions, to change you to be more like Christ each day, and to lead you into service to God and man.

I believe that the higher the number of our members who accept the challenge to read through the Bible in 2014, the more blessings God will bestow upon our church AND the more we will be able to minister to our community in the name of and with the love of Christ. Accept the challenge; be blessed; and become a blessing.


