"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and

So you've eaten the last of the Christmas dinner leftovers (why did I buy a 25lb. turkey?), returned that sweater from Aunt June that you probably wouldn't wear to Wal-Mart at 3 a.m. in the middle of a blizzard, waved good-bye to your cousin Eddie and his 3 darling kids who have broken 3 pieces of your Christmas china along with years 1983, 1997, 2002 and 2006 Hallmark Charlie Brown ornaments. As you collapse on the couch to enjoy a cup of coffee, your eyes fall on the calendar. New Year's Day is just a few days away. 2017!

If you are like most people, you look with hope to a coming new year. In the new year we see a fresh start; a chance to do better than the last year. Many of us turn to New Year's Resolutions as a way to better ourselves.

"I resolve to:

• Exercise more.

of the Son and of the Holy Spirit..." Matthew 28:19

- Eat healthier.
- Stop smoking.
- Stop procrastinating (OK, I'll start that one next month!).
- Be calmer."

I don't know about you, but whenever I make these "resolutions", I find that they may last a few weeks, or a month or two at most. Then, in my inevitable weakness I crumble. I fail. I give up. If I can't stick to my resolutions, then it seems that they are no good, so why not just surrender?

Many people view sin like our resolutions. In the beginning, when we are inspired to do better, we think that we have the ability to resist sin (greed, anger, lusts, intolerance, refusal to forgive), but before too long, we find that in our human nature we fail. As Christians, though, we are called to do something other than to just surrender to our weakness and give in to sin. As Christians we are given the gift of grace and forgiveness.

In Romans 7 and 8 Paul discusses our human weakness and God's infinite grace.

Something to Pray About by Cindy Sears

"...Sing psalms, hymns, and sacred songs; sing to God with thanksgiving in your hearts. Everything you do or say then, should be done in the name of the Lord Jesus, as you give thanks through him to God the Father."

Thank you to my family; and, I give special thanks, to Ebenezer—my second family—for all your help. You have stepped up in a marvelous way to help me through my recent medical crisis. God has used you to bless me—and the blessings keep on coming. Thank you for living out the new commandment given by Jesus in John 13:34-35:

"And now I give you a new commandment: love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. If you have love for one another, then everyone will know that you are my disciples."

And you have proven that this is not a fake love by acting, instead of just talking; for as John the Apostle says in 1 John 3:16-18:

"This is how we know what love is: Christ gave his life for us. We too, then, ought to give our lives for others! If we are rich and see others in need, yet close our hearts against them, how can we claim that we love God? My children, our love should not be just words and talk; it must be true love, which shows itself in action."

I thank you again, and continually pray for you and our church, that we will continue to give so that others can know the love of God through our actions, as well as, our words of witness. I know that I, personally, fall short in doing this myself. But, God continues to work on me; so thank you for being such wonderful examples of Christian love and caring.

Because of what has happened this year, though I hate to continue to "beat this dead horse," I cannot remain silent about God remaining true to his word in Malachi 3:10 (CEB):

I decided last year when I was financially strapped because of various emergency situations that, no matter what is going on, I will give 10% of my income to the Lord (and more when I can). Church Council — November 21, 2016

Sonya Crouse opened the meeting with prayer. Boyd Johnson shared a devotional from Isaiah 40:31.

Jo Nell Harrison presented the **financial report**, and answered any questions regarding it.

The decision was made to move \$317 from the Bobby Little Fund to the Needy Fund.

We also moved \$7 from the Pairs and Spares Fund to the Stop Hunger Now Fund.

Topics of discussion:

Jay Bissett discussed the date for the annual planning retreat - date selected for now is January 7th from 9:00-4:00.

Sonya Crouse talked about the upcoming Stop Hunger Now event that is scheduled for Jan 21st. Ebenezer is committed to pack 10,000 meals. Susan Keener advised us that South Caldwell Interact Club wants to join in and match the 10,000 meals.

We will have a special service Sunday, January 29th, to celebrate Blanch Kohnle and Rachel Poe's 100th birthdays. The Bishop will attend and preach that Sunday. We will share a covered-dish meal afterwards.

Jay mentioned there probably won't be a December newsletter sent out.

Jay Bissett brought up that he has received several letters from Justin Shoemake asking if EUMC would help fund a class/degree in Abuse Counseling. The total cost is a one-time payment of \$997. After discussion, the Men's group voted to pay 1/3, Rainbow Sunday School Class will pay 1/3, and the Women's group will pay 1/3 - three payments of \$332.34 each.

Jay mentioned issues with the heat monitor not coming on at the parsonage. Keith Keener was going to check it out after the Council meeting.

Roy Hamby discussed the coming new Youth Pastor, Robert Edward Petree (Bobby), who will start January 1st, 2017. His pay is \$18,720 for 52 weeks at 20 hours per week, plus a 7% pension of \$1,310.

Jay Bissett suggested we give those that volunteered to work with the youth a token of appreciation. The unanimous vote was to give \$50 per couple to Natasha & Chris Haas, Terry and Scott Miller, and Candace and Jason Collins. This will be taken from the Youth Activity Fund.

Kim Ellis asked for help in setting up the new Chrismon Tree. Thanks to Steve Kohnle, Conner Johnson, Jimmy Stone, Keith Keener, Jeff Smith, and Linda Moretz for helping set it up. (Hope I didn't leave a name off....)

do. He is teaching me to trust him as I become more obedient to him. Righteousness is its own reward; though at times, it may seem to be a curse. Finally, I am accepting the truth that God is working for my good, while also training me to be good to others—and therefore better able to aid him in blessing others. I believe that God can redeem all bad things in my life—either here, or in the world to come. The riches he has in store for me, and all those who yearn for his appearing, are magnitudes better than anything I can ever acquire here in this fallen world. So, if I lose every possession, it won't change my love and gratitude to God. If I lose my health, it won't change my love and faith in God. If the world implodes tomorrow, it won't change my love and awe of my wonderful Savior and God—because none of these things will stop God from loving me, either.

I pray that all God's people will learn to trust him enough to be obedient to him in all things, so that he can use us more and more to constrain evil, to bless others, and to lead many more people to a saving faith in his blessed Son, Jesus Christ. Amen.



7: 21 - 25 "So I find this law at work: Although I want to do good, evil is right there with me. ²² For in my inner being I delight in God's law; but I see another law at work in me, waging war against the law of my mind and making me a prisoner of the law of sin at work within me. What a wretched man I am! Who will rescue me from this body that is subject to death? Thanks be to God, who delivers me through Jesus Christ our Lord!"

8:1 – 4 "Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death. For what the law was powerless to do because it was weakened by the flesh, God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in the flesh, in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fully met in us, who do not live according to the flesh but according to the Spirit."

So, as the new year approaches, it is a good thing that we reflect on the past year. Celebrate the victories. Examine our failures. Think about how we can do better in the coming year. As Christians, though, let us be realistic about our ability to change ourselves. If we rely on our own strength, we will eventually fail. But, praise God, that is not the end of the story. As Christians, we rely on God's grace and God's forgiveness to pick us up when we fall.

As Methodists, we believe that with enough trust, enough faith, enough perseverance, that we can succeed in "going on to perfection". A perfection that doesn't mean we never fail, but a perfection that has faith in God's grace to pick us up when we fall down, to encourage us when we are discouraged, and to love us when our love fails. Thanks be to God! Let us rely on God for a joyful and meaningful 2017!


