Something to Pray About

"All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work." –2 Timothy 3:16-17 NIV

BASIC DOCTRINE:
THE WORD OF GOD

In my previous article, I wrote about how the belief in God is logical, and was pervasive in the ancient world—and even in the world today. The main arguments against the Creator God are disagreements about His nature, and His laws for right living. Practically, all people believe in a higher power than mankind. If a person does not fulfill that desire for an ultimate authority with the one true God, he is open to such substitutes as false gods, demons, government, cult leaders, ideologies that deny reality, wealth, worship of nature, or personal power.

Christians (and the Jews) rely upon the Bible for discovering the nature of, and for information on how we are to live (morality) and worship/serve God.

God's written word has been under attack for centuries. Often this involves "book burning," or the creation and promotion of alternative stories or books (especially related to Jesus the Christ in the early days of Christianity). The main attacks today revolve around denial of certain parts of the Bible, or denial of Scripture as divinely inspired, or attacking the historical facts in the Bible as unreliable or wrong. I once subscribed to the magazine "Biblical Archaeology," which showed how discoveries by archaeologists kept proving how accurate the Bible's history actually is. Yet, people continue to claim that there are inaccuracies in the Bible.

Men continue to attempt to undermine the Word of God. Parts of the Bible have been expunged—Thomas Jefferson cut out all the miracles in the New Testament Gospels. New books have been added—major example is the Mormon Church, which has its extra-biblical sacred texts. Some people claim to have found secret code in the Bible or hidden knowledge that only the "chosen" can see. Or they claim that God has changed the meaning of certain passages, because we live in a more enlightened era. This is the height of arrogance, since even Jesus said, "Do not think that I have come to abolish the Law or the Prophets; I have not come to abolish them but to fulfill them. I tell you the truth, until heaven and earth disappear, not the smallest letter, not the least stroke of a pen, will by any means disappear from the Law until everything is accomplished." (Matthew 5:17-18 NIV)

Another way to undermine the Word of God is to produce "translations" or "new revelations" that purport to be the "true" meanings of the words in the Bible. Bible translations that are highly suspect include the Passion Bible from a man who claims that Jesus actually appeared in his room, and "downloaded" words into him as he "translated" the Bible into more modern

language. These and others should take note of what the Apostle John wrote in The Book of Revelation: "I warn everyone who hears the words of the prophecy of this book: If anyone adds anything to them, God will add to him the plagues described in this book. And if anyone takes words away from this book of prophecy, God will take away from him his share in the tree of life and in the holy city, which are described in this book." (Revelation 22:18-19 NIV) Even though John was speaking specifically of the Book of Revelation, this can be applied to all of God's Word. Because these new translations or works can lead the innocent astray or away from God, they are in danger of feeling the full wrath of God. As Jesus said, "But whoso shall offend one of these little ones which believe in me, it were better for him that a millstone were hanged about his neck, and that he were drowned in the depth of the sea." (Matthew 18:6 KJV)

The most reliable translations involve teams of Bible scholars who know Greek, Latin, and Hebrew; and their work is critiqued by others before the translation is published. No, Jesus did not speak in King James English, but the KJV is one of the more reliable translations. As older or more reliable copies of books of the Bible have been discovered, words have been altered in the Bible, but only after careful study and prayerful consideration. Usually, the meaning has not been altered by much; and the important doctrinal issues have not been undermined in any way by these edits.

For a tome that includes 66 books from about 40 authors, written over the course of centuries, the Bible is very unified and consistent. When you consider that the words had to be copied by hand for most of those centuries, so that copies were available for reading to a larger audience; it is miraculous that the Bible has come down to us at all, and that we have so many copies of the Word from ancient times and today. Satan has attempted to have it destroyed by using tyrannical rulers and governments, but God has preserved His Word in all instances. To me this, along with fulfilled prophecies, and inclusion of shameful behavior by even the heroes in the Bible, is another sign that it is the Word of God, and not of men.

In closing, the Bible is our main source of information about God, and our relationship with Him. Christian doctrine is built on the stories and prophecies and letters found in God's written Word. It is therefore a major foundation of the Church. If we undermine His written Word, we undermine our faith and our relationship with our Creator. "One's attitude toward the Scriptures determines his ability to understand and appreciate the august doctrines they proclaim. If the divine inspiration and veracity of the bible are rejected, then any system of truth it contains cannot be relied upon." (All the Doctrines of the Bible, Lockyer, p. 3) Do not treat it lightly, or ignore it; read it, learn it, and learn from it. You will not regret being steeped in knowledge that comes from God. Who else can know what is truly best for us?

Living in the POWER

In my career, I listened to many potential terrorists who had one thing in common – how they described Christians. They would say Christians are "weak in spirit and discipline", or "Christians don't know what it means to die for God". Now as a believer, I see how those words should NEVER be used to describe a follower of Christ!

Our courage comes from knowing that we have the Holy Spirit's power and that Christ lives within us to overcome any kind of obstacle. Every man dies but very few really live. That's the choice we have because Jesus Christ died for us to have life, and life more abundantly. We must choose to stand in the power of the Lord.

Preaching the Gospel is giving the good news of salvation through Christ, with authority and power. We should not be concerned with popularity, polls, or politics but with God's word going out to all his people. The great commission is a commandment for the believers to go and make disciples of all nations, teaching them to obey everything He commanded. There is no caveat that says we only do this when it is

comfortable, or that it is merely a suggestion in a plethora of options. God's truth is binary – it's not a spectrum. There's good and evil, truth and falsehood. Saying that is not being judgmental, it's being honest. I lived under the oppression of a false religion for decades. I refuse to lie so I can spare someone's feelings because I want them to experience the love and freedom that comes from accepting Christ. People have problems. Jesus is the solution.
