CHANGE & THE UNCHANGING

Though the snow is pretty and it can be fun to toss snowballs at your friends (or enemies), the return of spring flowers and green leaves on all the trees is wonderful, too. Some changes can be bad, though; such as your body beginning to sag in all the wrong places, wood rotting, weeds growing, memories failing, good people and friends gone away, a job lost, a good worker retired.

Well, change is definitely coming to Ebenezer in July. We are saying goodbye to some dear friends and a passionate, encouraging leader of our church. Rev. Eric and Beth Lane will be moving to another church at the end of June. We knew the day would be coming; but we hoped it never would, too.

Church Council Minutes — April 24, 2016

Attendees: Becky Clark, Sonya Crouse, Kim Ellis, Roy Hamby, Jo Nell Harrison, Bleaka Hollar, Boyd & Emily Johnson, Connor Johnson, Keith Keener, JoAnn Knepp, Jerry Kohnle, Rev. Eric Lane, Judy McCrary, Cinda McCrary, Linda Moretz, Cindy Sears, Jessica Haas, and Alice Hill.

The meeting was called to order by Chairperson, Boyd Johnson. Bleaka Hollar said the opening prayer. Boyd read from a devotional based on Psalm 27:14.

Keith Keener made a motion to waive the reading of April's minutes, because we had no copies (copier was down). Motion passed.

Finance Report.

Jo Nell Harrison told us that there is about \$136,250 left on the CLC mortgage. We have \$13,000 in the bank to pay on bills, etc. Eric informed us of some items (money) that will go to the new pastor; and what has already been paid out to Eric.

Our electric bill was up. Eric said that is probably due to the perimeter CLC lights outside, because the timer was cut off. We will see about reprogramming that, so the lights will not stay on so long at night.

Everything is inline on the regular expenses.

Roy Hamby mentioned that the Finance Committee said that people will be required to stay in their budget parameters. He asked Kim if the \$4,000 will be enough for VBS. Kim said that she is not sure. The cost of the food is most likely to put us over the budget. We have the largest VBS in the county, and the food is a good talking point for the event. Jo Nell told Kim that she would be glad to help with the overage this year, if needed.

Kim said that we need to make sure that all the lights are turned off, and the toilets are not stuck. There are two toilets that tend to get stuck and continuing to run. Keith will find someone to check that out.

Old Business

Basketballs were acquired. Phone Tree is working. There have been a few glitches reported, but overall the system is working fine. The Undergrace Class owes us some money. Jo Nell stated that money from group fundraisers need to be put in their specific fund; then Jo Nell can move the money to the church fund that it goes to, such as the Building Fund or the Van Fund, etc.

The Youth Minister's job description has not been set yet. It needs to be finalized before we begin advertising for the position. A Committee will be going through the applications, and the new pastor, Jay Bissett, will be involved later in the process of hiring.

Concerning wiring in the nursery: Randy got a price. It will be anywhere from \$200-500 to fix the wiring, so that the nursery workers can hear the worship service. Jimmy Stone said that we may be able to use the wi-fi to pipe the service into the nursery instead. Keith Keener will check with him on that before spending any money.

An in-house Safe Sanctuary workshop has not been scheduled yet.

CLC mortgage re-financing: Jo Nell believes it might be better to leave it as is, since the bank has agreed to let us go another year with the current loan agreement. Things are unsettled right now, so we cannot be sure we'll be able to get better terms. Keith made a motion to continue with the current mortgage; Roy seconded; motion passed.

New Business

Trustees had the parsonage inspected, as required before a new pastor comes in. There are no major issues; just minor recommendations, such as cutting back shrubs, smoke detector replaced, etc. We will need a new desk for the pastor's office.

The Communion Stewards reported that some of the linens are badly stained and need to be replaced. Sonya would like to look for some replacements. She will price some and then get back to the Council on the cost. Emily and Boyd agreed to split the cost and buy some new ones at Sam's.

Eric wants to take his computer with him. Kim made a motion to let him do so; Cinda seconded; motion passed.

Upcoming important dates: On June 26th, we will have one worship

service, which will be a day of reflection and celebration of Eric's service to Ebenezer. On July 10, our new pastor, Jay Bissett will be commissioned for service at Ebenezer. This will be a one-worship service day also. Then on July 31st, we will have another combined worship service with covered-dish afterward to officially welcome Jay Bissett to our church and community.

Eric and Boyd said that Jay is really passionate about keeping up the Habitat program, so we need to begin raising money for that again.

Boyd adjourned the meeting. Sonya closed us in prayer.

river of your goodness. You are the source of all life, and because of your light we see the light."

--Psalm 36:5-9 GNT

No matter what changes occur in our lives or the church, our God remains with us. We can count on him to be with us and care for us and guide us through all changes, good and bad.

We have had to say good-bye to many leaders and workers in our church over the years. Now we are saying good-bye to Eric, but our mission continues—as it did when the great prophet Moses died in the wilderness:

"There has never been a prophet in Israel like Moses; the LORD spoke with him face-to-face. No other prophet has ever done miracles and wonders like those that the LORD sent Moses to perform against the king of Egypt, his officials, and the entire country. No other prophet has been able to do the great and terrifying things that Moses did in the sight of all Israel."

-- Deuteronomy 34:10-12 GNT

"After the death of the LORD's servant Moses, the LORD spoke to Moses' helper, Joshua son of Nun. He said, 'My servant Moses is dead. 
