Pastor's Note

There is a short work of John Wesley called "The Character of a Methodist." In it he explains what sets a Methodist Christian apart from other Christians. The spoiler alert in all of this is that Wesley did not believe that Methodists were some strange type of Christian. Rather, Methodists were simply Christians.

In 2022 I want to share with you what Wesley thought made us distinctive, and to encourage us to grab onto these points as we grow in our faith.

The first point he made was that Methodists were not set apart by their "opinions." I find that to be something to think about when we live in a time where a person's "opinions" have such importance over facts.

He laid out that there were three things a Methodist believed:

- 1. All scripture is given by the inspiration of God.
- 2. We believe the written word of God to be the only and sufficient rule both of Christian faith and practice.
- 3. We believe Christ to be the eternal, supreme God.

Those three professions were considered by him to be foundational to faith. They are foundational to us who are Methodist Christians. Beyond that he said, "But as to all opinions which do not strike at the root of Christianity, we think and let think."

In an age of opinion that is a good reminder of not getting caught up in disputes, especially with fellow Christians, which do not impact what is foundational to our faith. You may believe one thing about (fill in the blank) and I another. If what we believe does not deny those foundational statements, then it is not something to fight over.

As we enter 2022, let us remember what binds us together.

Reference: Deuteronomy 30:1-10; Interpreter's Bible, v. 2, pp. 507-509.

No one and no nation are ever too far gone to repent and turn back to God, and be blessed (Consider Jonah and the Ninivites). Although the fight to regain our freedoms lost in the United States, which was established as a nation under God and as a "city on a hill," is growing stronger each day; we cannot win this battle until there is true repentance, in the church and outside the church.

Called Charge Conferences/Council Meetings in December 2021

Called Charge Conference Ebenezer United Methodist Church Of Granite Falls, NC December 9 2021 at 7:00 pm.

Attendees: Rev. Alan I. Gaylord, Marsha McRary (Council Chair), Irene Austin (Financial Secretary), Ted Daniel, Bleaka Hollar (Lay Leader), Monte Hollar, Linda Moretz, Cindy Sears.

Meeting was called to order by Rev. Alan I. Gaylord at 7:00 p.m. He gave the opening prayer. Rev. Gaylord first informed us that he had been authorized by D. S. Lori Beth Huffman to conduct this meeting.

He then proceeded to give us some background on the Boy Scouts of America attempt to declare bankruptcy, because of the high level of sexual abuse lawsuits against their organization related to cases over the past 50+ years. Currently, our church (Ebenezer UMC) has had no claims made against it, but there are approximately 4,000 cases pending in the Western North Carolina Conference.

Rev. Gaylord then told us that our conference was recommending to vote NO to the proposed settlement, because it does not offer enough protection to our churches that have or have had Boy Scout troops, nor to other smaller charter groups that the UMC is also representing, among other issues.

Question: What was the money for that we paid earlier over this issue? That money was used to hire the lawyers who are representing the UMC and other chartering organizations in this bankruptcy mediation case. There was further general discussion.

After Rev. Gaylord read the proposal to vote NO on the BSA Plan of Reorganization. Monte Hollar made a motion to accept the ballot as written with the NO vote. Marsha McRary seconded. All present approved the motion. Motion carried. Rev. Gaylord is therefore

authorized by Ebenezer UMC to sign the ballot for us, including for any upcoming changes to the reorganization plan.

Meeting adjourned.

Pastor Alan explained that the UMC had come to an agreement with the Boy Scouts of America that was satisfactory to the UMC and the other charter organizations that could become entangled in the lawsuits against the BSA; so the Conference was requesting that we reverse our previous vote to say "No" to the settlement, and now say "Yes." The Council voted to change our position to align with the UMC Conference position and vote "Yes" for the settlement.
