Something to Pray About by Cindy Sears

Now that we have been put right with God through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

-Romans 5:1 GNT



Have you ever started to pray to God for something, and then began thinking that you do not deserve to receive anything good from God? I catch myself doing this often—thinking that I am not "good enough" to receive good things; that I am unworthy of the blessings I already have, so how can I possibly have the gall to request even more blessings?

Yet, a true believer in Christ has no need of shame, no reason to feel guilty. In Christ you deserve mercy from God, and you are worthy enough to receive blessings from God.

"But now God's way of putting people right with himself has been revealed. It has nothing to do with law...God puts people right through their faith in Jesus Christ. God does this to all who believe in Christ...by the free gift of God's grace all are put right with him through Christ Jesus, who sets them free." --Romans 3:21-24 (selected portions) (GNT)

When God looks at a Christian disciple He sees His Son, Jesus Christ. Therefore, there is no need to work to be deserving of God's grace, His mercy, or His provisioning. As a Christian, you do not need to earn your way into heaven. God has given you that reward as a gift through His Son, Jesus Christ. Heaven, or living with God the Creator, is the natural home of Jesus Christ. As His followers, heaven, or living in the presence of God the Creator, is our natural home now, too.

Also, you do not have to earn God's pleasure or His blessings. If you have a need, ask that it be filled. You do not have to feel deserving of God's mercy, grace, or His provisioning. The only consideration in what you ask for is whether or not it is within the circle of God's will for you, His church, and His kingdom's work. (Just don't forget that God puts a high priority on "community" and "covenant" when you are asking and looking for a "yes" answer to your requests. It isn't all about you or your idea of happiness.)

God knows that you need food, shelter, clothing, and companionship and love, and even beautiful and pleasurable things in your life—ask Him for these things. He knows that you have needs for specific items to help you serve Him better, and to help you be more joyful and better able to witness for Him. Ask, seek, knock and wait for the door to open; the gift to appear.

And do not box God in. Do not box yourself into a preconceived idea of what you need to be God's witness and representative in the world. "God works in mysterious ways His wonders to perform."* Do not box yourself into a preconceived idea of what you need to be happy either. God knows you better than you can ever know yourself. Let Him work on you in His way and in His own time. He will sanctify you (make you a new creature in Christ Jesus) —IF you let Him!

So, when you pray, go ahead and tell God what you think you need or

Pastor's corner — Rev. Eric Lane

I have said on many occasions how blessed I am to have the opportunity to serve Ebenezer. I am proud not just of who you are, but even more of what God is doing within the lives of the people of Ebenezer.

In saying that, I must also give warning that we not allow our pride to get in the way of God's work for our lives. As seen throughout the scriptures, too often pride is what has led the people, and even God's very own servants, to fall into sin. Our pride sometimes is reflected in the words we speak.

You have perhaps heard the old saying "well I just simply spoke before I thought," or "it just rolled off my tongue," or how about this one, "My tongue moved faster than my brain." The point that I am trying to make is that, while we remember that old rhyme that says; "sticks and stones may break my bones but words will never hurt me," words do hurt, and words do cause damage; damage that, at times, cannot be easily undone, and goes bevond just ourselves.

We only have to look at those in the media to see how our words can cause harm. We have seen businesses fail and careers be damaged, which not only hurt the owner, but all those who earned their livings from those businesses. As in the story of the adulterous woman, too often we are like those who were ready to cast the first stone. The reality is that we need to be more mindful of the words of our Lord and Savior who said, ""Let any one of you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." (John 8:7, NIV).

It is no wonder that Jesus told us, "What goes into someone's mouth does not defile them, but what comes out of their mouth, that is what defiles them." (Matthew 15:11, NIV) Satan, the devil, the evil one, name it what you want, has used the words we say as stumbling blocks for the kingdom of God, perhaps more than anything else I can think of.

The Bible says that we should love our neighbor, but Jesus takes things a little further and says to "...love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you..." So how can we love our neighbors and enemies, and pray for those who persecute us when we are using our words to build walls of separation, or as arrows to fling against one another?

The church is about building the kingdom, God's kingdom, not an earthly kingdom. The way we build that kingdom is by living a life that reflects the life of Jesus Christ. We need to keep in mind that Jesus could have uttered the words, and His Father would have released, as that old hymn goes, ten thousand angels; but, instead, he said "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." Words can destroy or words can bring about healing and forgiveness.

I will close with a little rhyme that I was taught and probably (if you are as old as I am) know as well. It goes like this:

Before we speak, it would be wise of us to take time to pray about our words. I have said many times that the words we speak can be used either to build bridges that unite us or to build walls that keep us separated. May the words that we speak and the things that we do bring glory and honor and praise to our Lord and God always.

Church Council — September 14, 2014

Gerald Frye called the meeting to order and opened with prayer. He then read a Psalm. Minutes stand as printed.

Financial Report

Our financial situation is looking good. We will pay an extra \$1000 on the mortgage this month. We will pay our annual missions' amounts to the District Office, too. The UMW reported a goodly amount of money was raised at the Mexican Party and Arts and Crafts Show. The profit from that will go to the CLC mortgage.

Our annual \$10,000 Sunday is at Homecoming on October 12th. Please pray about this and dig a little deeper, so we can pay more of the mortgage off before we refinance next year.

Eric expressed his admiration for the way our church is working and the ministries that we are continuing to do each year for the Lord's kingdom. We are strong financially and in our attendance. Jo Nell commended the men for their participation in the administration of the church and its ministries, because many churches have only women to serve on committees, etc.

Gerald expressed appreciation for Jo Nell and Joann's work in helping to keep the finances of the church straight.

Old Business

We have raised about half of what we need to buy the 8 **cordless microphones** for the Praise Band. The lawn mower has been repaired again and is now working. The Church Photo Directory has been printed, and will be picked up on Monday.

Eric reported on the **October Revival** plans. We are considering providing some refreshments on Sunday evening and on Wednesday evening that will be self-serve. We are

also going to work on videos to show during the services with our members talking about our church and its ministries. Eric reported that 73% of the people in Caldwell County are not affiliated at all with a church. There a plenty of people that can be drawn in. We will also be giving a reward to the person who brings in the most people to the services. The speaker will be Jesse Carr. He will speak every night. We have **prayer chains** going on and are asking people to pray for specific aspects of the revival. The services will be held in the Christian Life Center.

our workers for next year. We need
people willing to work and to lead,
because we want to continue to grow in
size and in our ministries.

New Business

Cathy Huffman spoke to the council about the Alaska Mission trip. She suggested that we consider setting up a Mission Scholarship for lay people who may want to go on a mission trip in the future. This would not be a budget item, but a designated fund that is %100 voluntary contributions. There could be a committee set up to determine the distribution of the funds based upon need. Keith Keener made a motion to set up the fund and set up the committee to handle the dispersion of the funds. Sonya Crouse made the second. No further discussion. Cathy Huffman agreed to head up the Committee, choose members, and set up the rules for dispersing the funds.

We had a chance to buy a buffer to use to wax and buff the CLC floors ourselves, but we decided against it. It would be too difficult to arrange for people to do the work.

Greeters: Eric read a description of the need and what the service would entail (written by Beth Lane). He asked for the Council's opinion. Scott Miller spoke up and said that he would work harder to help out and Gerald Frye suggested that the description of the service be copied and sent to the classes to ask people to sign up to be greeters.

Beth Lane has agreed to help out with the acolyte service again, but she wants us to find someone to take over.

Ricky Baker announced the **Wyll Baker Golf Tournament and** wondered if the Council was interested in sponsoring a hole or a team. Money goes to help with Wyll's bills that his insurance does not cover. Barbara Miller made a motion that we sponsor three holes for the tournament. That would be \$300. Keith made a second to the motion. Motion passed.

Gerald closed out the meeting with a reading from the latest newsletter article by Cindy Sears about serving the Lord. He then read from Eric's words in the same newsletter about serving, and Gerald requested that we pray and consider our place of service for the Lord and this church in the coming year. Jerry Kohnle said the closing prayer.

He knows your name. He cared enough to send His Son, Jesus, to die on the cross for you. He watches over you. He desires to hear from you. In Christ, you deserve to be loved by God and to be cared for by God.

And what can separate us from God's love once we are in Christ?


