Something to Pray About by Cindy Sears

All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness—2 Timothy 3:16

God to Job: "Were you there when I made the world?" Job 38:4a

God's Word or Satan's Lies

Genesis 1:1 -- In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth.

Genesis 1:5,8,13,19,23,31 – And there was evening, and there was morning—the "first, second, third, fourth, fifth, sixth" day.

Genesis 2:1-3 -- Thus the heavens and the earth were completed in all their vast array. By the seventh day God had finished the work he had been doing; so on the seventh day he rested from all his work. Then God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it he rested from all the work of creating that he had done.

Luke 24:5-6 – Full of fear, the women bowed down to the ground, as the men said to them, "Why are you looking among the dead for one who is alive? He is not here; he has been raised. Remember what he said to you while he was in Galilee: 'The Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, be crucified, and three days later rise to life.'"

Mark 16:6 -- And he saith unto them, "Be not affrighted: Ye seek Jesus of Nazareth, which was crucified: he is risen; he is not here: behold the place where they laid him."

1 Corinthians 15:3-6 -- For what I received I passed on to you as of first importance[a]: that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, that he was buried, that he was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, and that he appeared to Cephas, and then to the Twelve. After that, he appeared to more than five hundred of the brothers and sisters at the same time, most of whom are still living, though some have fallen asleep.

Which set of passages above do you believe are true? Did God create the earth and the universe in 6 days? The Hebrew word for day used in the Genesis passages always refers to one twenty-four hour day. The designation, "evening and morning" emphasizes an actual 24 hour day—so no one should be confused about what God meant when he had Moses write these words. If you believe that Jesus was crucified (even secular scholars confirm that Jesus was in fact crucified), and that he rose on the third day, and now abides in heaven at the right hand of God, interceding on our behalf, why would you not believe the rest of God's word?

Christians have allowed God's word to be nullified by embracing the *theory* of evolution or letting their children be taught that this *theory* is in fact true without providing evidence for the alternative *theory* that God is the Creator of all things. The evidence against the *theory* of evolution becomes more compelling every day. Actually, it's the lack of evidence that is proving the *theory* of evolution is a non-starter. Textbooks continue to include "evidences" that have been proven to be 1) hoaxes, 2) misrepresentations,

Church Council Minutes for September 23, 2018

Attendees: Rev. Tom Hunter, Ricky Baker, David & Sonya Crouse, Kim Ellis, Barbara Ferguson, Roy Hamby, Jo Nell Harrison, Bleaka Hollar, JoAnn Knepp, Judy McCrary, Cinda McRary, Will McRary, Phyllis Minton, Cindy Sears, and Patty Coffey.

David Crouse called the meeting to order at 4:33 p.m. Bleaka was asked to give the opening prayer. Our devotional material came from Galatians 6:9+. David emphasized that we must not become weary in doing good, as the scriptures attest. We pulled together well to do the job required of us for the barbecue fundraiser. Let's continue to do so. He then commended our church on a successful barbecue and for touching lives in our community through this event.

Finance Report

August Report – Jo Nell Harrison. We had a good August for giving with the fundraisers and regular giving. She has been paying the Apportionment payment every two weeks if the funds are available. After the next payment, we will have paid around \$8,000 this year. The van sell has helped to keep us in the black, even though we did not take in enough in regular giving to keep our regular bills paid.

Jo Nell then presented the Budget for 2019 Worksheet, which we voted on later in the meeting (see below). She told us that we now owe about \$35,000 on the CLC mortgage. We hope to have it paid off in the next 20 months or less.

General Fund: We took in approx. \$191,100 in a year's time (includes some 2017 and 2018 reports). Our budget for next year will be \$206,684. The Building Fund is an additional \$25,416 for next year.

Minutes were read from August meeting, and passed as read.

Old Business

Pastor Tom brought up his intent to have **Confirmation classes**, either during Sunday school or on Wednesday evenings. There was general discussion. Tom stated that he wants to open the class up to anybody who has not been through such a class, including adults. If you are interested, please talk to Pastor Tom. The class will last for 6-8 weeks. Kim and Tom will talk to the parents and decide when to have the classes.

The UMM reported that the church's sign at the Dudley bridge crossroads has been replaced. New letters were purchased, too, and some other small signs at other intersections were refurbished. The UMM paid for all of this.

New Business

Kim Ellis reported that we are planning a **Christmas play**, using children and a few adults on December 16th. We will have another **birthday party for Jesus** afterwards. The festivities will begin at 5:00 p.m. On Sunday, December 2nd we will have the **Hanging of Greens** during our worship

service as we decorate for the Advent season. (We will not have communion until the Christmas Eve Candlelight service).

Roy Hamby of the Trustees informed us that he is taking bids for a new cleaning service for our church. He is asking classes to take out their trash and keeping their rooms as clean as possible while we work on getting a new janitorial service in place. There was a general discussion and suggestions from the council members.

Roy also reported that the fallen cemetery headstones are in the process of being lifted back up. There are some stones that may need bigger repairs, requiring bonding materials and taking them to the shop to fix. The Cemetery fund will take care of all of this.

Our Gateway breakfast and fellowship for the students and teachers at Gateway School is scheduled for 9:30 a.m. on November 19th, though Kim is trying to get it changed to the 20th.

Sonya reported that we now have 8 counters. Yeah! She has set a schedule for the next few months using the new people. We thank our volunteers that provide this vital service to our church.

Homecoming is set for October 14th at 10:30 a.m. Tom reported that we will have a sermon series on "The Joy Stealers" for the next few Sundays afterwards, instead of having a fall revival. We will be given a prayer focus for each Sunday of these sermons.

Our Charge Conference is scheduled for right after the service on Sunday October 14th. Since this is Homecoming Sunday, Tom said he will check on changing this date to October 21st. The District Dialog will be on the 14th from 3-5:00 p.m. (registration at 2:30 p.m.) at Grace Chapel UMC.

The vote on the 2019 budget proposal was taken: Motion made to accept by Tom and Bleaka. Passed.

Christian Education Fellowship classes start at Dudley Shoals elementary school in November. There will be a meeting on September 27th at 6:30 p.m. at Dudley Shoals Baptist Church. The CEF classes introduce children to Christianity, and include stories, games, and snacks in the after school sessions. Potential volunteers should attend this meeting.


The leftover barbecue is being sold at \$9 a pound+. So tell your friends and neighbors.
